

Suubi Health Center

Suubi serves the population of Luuka District in Eastern Uganda. It provides affordable and quality health services to 58 villages including maternal and child health, outpatient and inpatient services, laboratory, neonatal and pre-mature care, family planning, ambulance and community outreaches services. Suubi is also the service provider for the government's immunization programme for 6 villages in Bukanga Subcounty.

Shanti Health Center

Shanti provides affordable health services and a community outreach program to the population of Luwero District. It primarily provides maternity services but also offers inpatient and outpatient services, immunization and health education. It also runs a 2-acre nutritional garden promoting regenerative agricultural and food production.




"I earned daily income for 2 years, paid off the loan and bought a plot of land in town"

Dan wants to get another motorcycle and eventually own fleet of them and hire other fellow youths.





Infrastructure Development 14.6%

Finish construction of the 5-storey main hospital block. Suubi will have a **60 patient bed capacity**, a blood bank, surgical theater, female ward, children's ward and an administrative unit. The block will provide the infrastructure capacity to serve a catchment population of more than **500,000 people**.
